

Reviewer's Guidelines

- 1.** The peer-review of a manuscript is a confidential process. Reviewers should keep the whole process completely confidential.
- 2.** The reviewers should provide their reports in a timely fashion since a prompt review leads to the timely publication of a manuscript.
- 3.** A reviewer should not reveal any content of any manuscript unless the manuscript is accepted for publication and, in that case, only after publication.
- 4.** If a reviewer has evidence of plagiarism by the author of a manuscript, the reviewer should report it to the journal's editors immediately.
- 5.** If a reviewer has evidence of duplicate submission by the author of a manuscript, the reviewer should report it to the journal's editors immediately.
- 6.** Reviewers should avoid the use of intemperate or argumentative language in their reviews of manuscripts.
